The HSE has established a Disease Reduction Programme (DRP) as part of the FIT3 Programme (fit for work, fit for life, fit for tomorrow). The aim of DRP is to achieve a significant reduction in the incidence (new cases) of work-related ill health caused by exposure to hazardous substances.

Work-related dermatitis accounts for a significant proportion of work-related ill health. Employers, managers, and safety professionals are expected to play key roles in preventing work-related dermatitis.

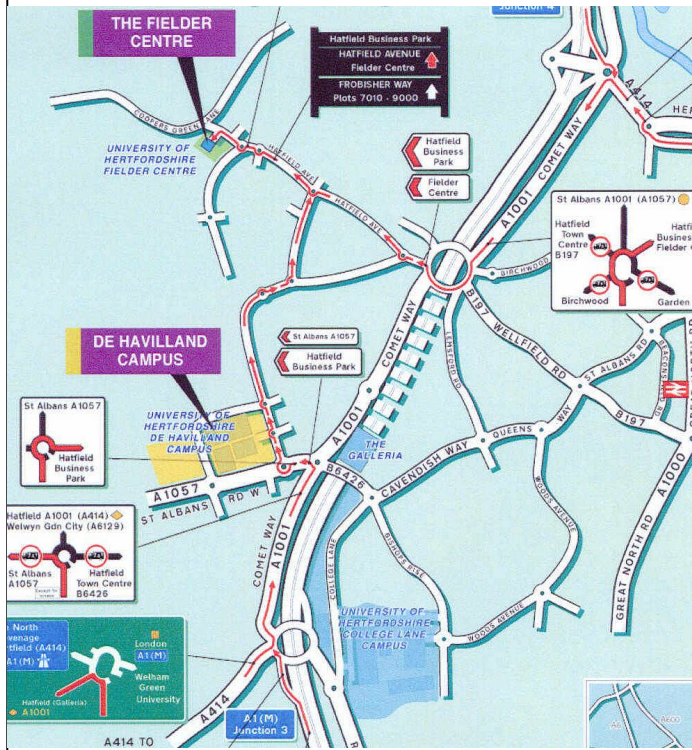
DIRECTIONS TO THE FIELDER CENTRE

By Road

The Fielder Centre is located approximately 1 mile from the A1 at Hatfield. Exit at Junction 3 Northbound or Junction 4 Southbound. Follow A1001 Comet Way and follow signs for Hatfield Business Park. When you reach Hatfield Avenue, follow the signs for Fielder Centre. Ample free parking space is available.

By Rail

The nearest station to The Fielder Centre is Hatfield Station. There are train services between London (Kings Cross) and Hatfield, fastest journey time 22 minutes and London (Moorgate) and Hatfield, 40 minutes. The Fielder Centre is 20-30 minute walk from the Station, or approximately 5 minutes by Taxi.
